C.A. Heimer. *Punctuated Globalization: Law, Institutionalization, and Globalization in Medicine and Healthcare.*

The complexity and variability of globalization has long been recognized. Yet when we speak of the globalization of some substantive field, it is all too easy to fall into giving summary statements that gloss over variations among subparts of the field, among regions of the world, and among causes of globalization. This project uses the case of medicine and health care to look closely at variability in globalization and to think about the contribution of law to this variability. It decomposes medicine and health care into a series of domains, looking closely at each to see which domains are more and which less globalized, which participants are more and less globalized, and what role law plays in encouraging or discouraging the globalization of medicine and health care. I argue that the pattern of unevenness in globalization – what I call punctuated globalization – in part reflects the cyclical processes of legal change, followed by adjustment to new legal regimes, in turn followed by further legal adjustments. After preliminary analysis of published materials on the “domains” of healthcare, the project has been on hold during completion of book project (*Governing the Global Clinic*, now completed and under review).
